The General Services Administration (GSA) was created by American Congress to service the workplace needs of all federal agencies.

The Administration supports government employees in 8,000 federally owned or leased buildings (comprising 339 million square feet)

in 2,000 American communities. One of the GSA's primary responsibilities is the procurement of products, including furnishings, on behalf of the agencies it represents.

GSA and AWI: Partners for Quality

When the tenants of GSA-managed buildings require furnishings, they turn to the GSA and its network of approved suppliers. All such suppliers must meet the GSA's exacting standards for quality, value, and customer service.

Where wood furnishings and finishes are concerned, the GSA has deferred to the Architectural Woodwork Institute's (AWI) Quality Certification Program (QCP) since 2001. The Program certifies whether products and projects are in compliance with the Institute's Quality Standards Illustrated, the industry benchmark for quality interior architectural woodwork.



The GSA asserts that the construction, renovation, and furnishing of the government buildings it manages must be performed under the auspices of the AWI's Quality Certification Program. Specifically, woodwork-related services and products must be supplied by QCP-approved parties, or "Certified Participants."

AWI Certified, GSA Approved
